Give Victims Time: Judiciary Committee Public Hearing

Connecticut's five-year statute of limitations for sexual assault crimes is the third shortest in the nation. Meanwhile, twenty-eight states have either no statute of limitations or a period of twenty years or more. Connecticut should follow in the footsteps of these states and not limit the time survivors can seek justice.
